Tidbits/Notes



With the latest updates on iOS 18, they updated the default mail app and how it filters mail. Some users may complain that they cant find emails, and it would not be Joinks issue, but rather the customers iPhone filtering their emails. To change/disable this, click the 3 three dots in the mail app in the top right corner, and change from group view to list view. You can also have the customer go through their settings and disable the contact images in the mail app updates as well.



"The iOS 18.2 update to the Mail app on iPhones introduced a major redesign, including automatic categorization of emails into Primary, Transactions, Updates, and Promotions tabs, as well as digest views that group emails from the same sender. These changes aim to streamline email management, but users have also expressed dissatisfaction and sought ways to revert to the previous layout. "
